



# **Camp Programs in Australia**

Study Geography domestically with Second Nature

### **GOLD COAST**



The Gold Coast is a tourism Mecca "famous for fun". With its golden sandy beaches, theme parks, attractions and World Heritage Listed National Parks, the city has plenty to offer in the way of environmental and social geography. Let Second Nature work with you to design a program that will best support your students' inclass learning. All field work includes options for disturbed and undisturbed sites.

Choose 2-20 days to design your own Geography camp!

- Plant/crab ID, adaptations, transects, quadrats

#### DAY 3 - Catchments

- Almost any waterway to choose from
- Physio-chemical, biological, habitat assessments
- · Upper/middle/lower river sampling sites

#### DAY 4 - Coastal

- Southern or Central GC beaches
- Up to 5x site study for data collection on day
- Plant ID, management review, transect, quadrats

#### DAY 5 - Paddock to Plate

- Animal farms/crops/organic/hydroponic etc.
- Up to 4x farms to visit for data collection
- · Talk directly with farmer with tour of farm

#### DAY 6 - Tourism

- Single day or multiple overnight experiences
- · Talk with hotel operators, academics, council
- · Site visits, presentations, university lectures

#### DAY 7 - Indigenous

- Stand-alone incursion/excursion or combo
- · Artefact displays, bush tucker, guided walks
- · Interactive preentation, boomerang throwing

#### DAY 8 - Urban

- Multiple sites to choose from (e.g. Burleigh)
- Up to 5x site study for data collection on day
- Site visits, speakers, traffic counts, surveys

#### DAY 9 - Stradbroke Is.

- North & South Stradbroke/Moreton Island
- Broad range of recreational activities
- Habitat-based field work, transects, quadrats

#### DAY 10 - Theme Park

- All GC-based theme parks/shows available



Collaborate with Second Nature to design a program that will support your students' in-class learning and provide unforgettable experiences. All field work includes options for disturbed and undisturbed sites.

### NORTH STRADBROKE ISLAND



North Stradbroke Island boasts incredible natural beauty in its freshwater lakes, forests, beaches and ocean-side cliffs. It is a great local option for schools from Southeast Qld and offers a variety of natural environments to study. Explore rehabilitated sand mines at Yarraman to coral communities at Amity Point to pristine mangrove forests at Myora Springs. Let Second Nature work with you to design a program that will best support your study group's in-class learning.
